## ONALASKA ARREST

An Onalaska man was arrested this week and charged with numerous counts of burglary and theft. Twenty year old Onalaska resident, Jonathan P. Huber was arrested on Tuesday November 8<sup>th</sup> and charged with 5 counts of burglary, 4 counts of theft and a 2008 Onalaska residential burglary.

On Monday November 7<sup>th</sup> an Onalaska Officer reported that his personal vehicle had been entered and an ipod taken. Onalaska Investigator Pete Jakowski checked the LeadsOnline system and determined that the ipod had been pawned at Pawn America by Huber's girlfriend. The officer's property was successfully recovered with Pawn America's cooperation. Police began looking for Huber in connection with the theft. Then early on November 8th an Onalaska resident leaving his home noticed that the dome light in his vehicle, which was parked in his garage, was on. He observed an unfamiliar vehicle leaving the area. Upon reaching his car he found that his wallet had been taken and immediately notified the Onalaska Police. When the Police responded the resident was able to give them the license number of the vehicle he saw leaving. Later that morning Onalaska

Officer Dan McCluskey located the vehicle parked behind an apartment complex in Onalaska. The owner of the vehicle, Mr. Huber was arrested on suspicion of theft and burglary. Upon searching the vehicle officers found debit and credit cards, a GPS, a Version Blackberry phone and cash, all stolen.

Also recovered from the vehicle were 2 ipods, 2 car stereo remotes, 2 digital recorders, an additional GPS unit, a lady's watch and a man's watch. At this time it is unknown whether or not these items are stolen.

"We are very grateful for Pawn America's cooperation and help in getting our Officer's property returned so promptly," said Onalaska Investigator Pete Jakowski, "we are also grateful to that quick thinking citizen for getting Huber's license plate number, citizens working in partnership with police like that make our job much easier."
